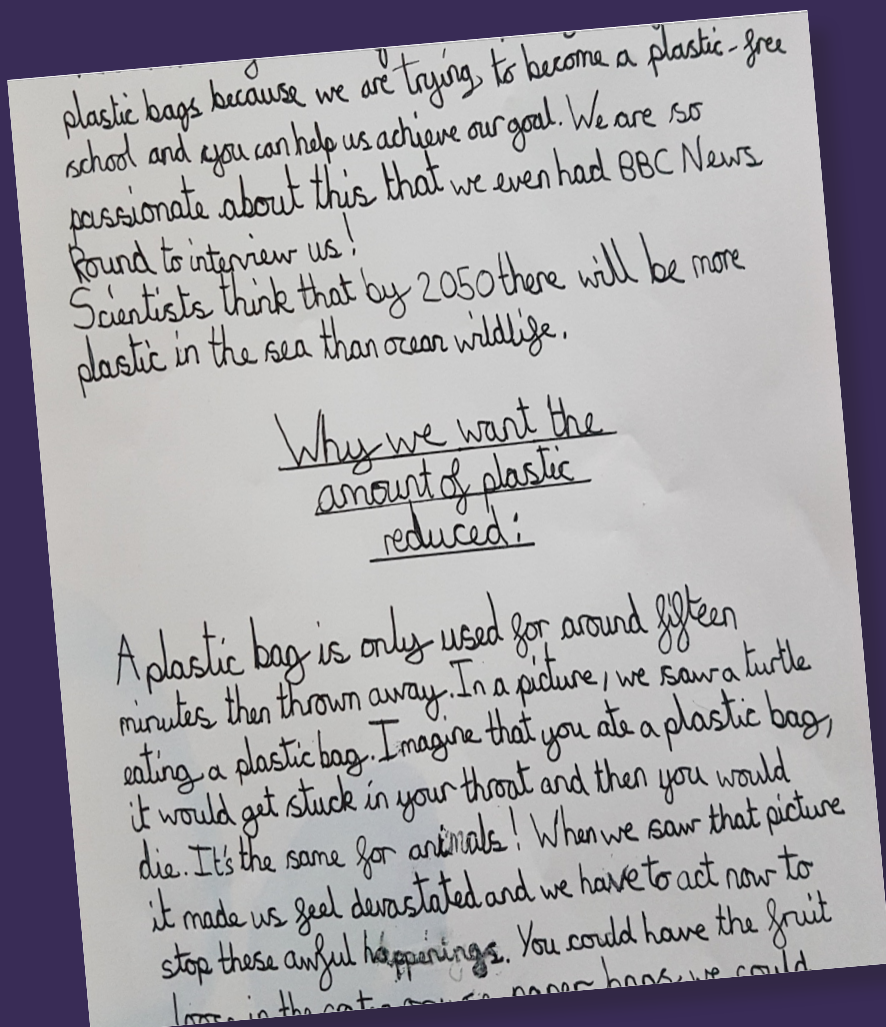

# 1. WRITE TO ORGANISATIONS

Children write letters to businesses and organisations linked to your schools asking them to reduce or find alternatives for their plastic packaging. **Don't take NO for an answer.**

## 2. REUSE SCRAP PAPER

Place a tray at the photocopier/printer to put any used, misprinted or unwanted paper from the printer so it can be reused in the classrooms for writing, art and crafts.

# 3. REDUCE PRINTING

Reduce printing and only print things only when necessary, double sided and, as always, buy recycled paper.



Keep everything electronic and think about electronic school reports to parents at the end of the year.

# 4. SWITCH TO U-FILL GLUE STICKS

The fact that glue sticks can be recycled is a **myth**. Make the switch to U-fill and stop thousands of glue sticks from ending up in landfill or incineration.

# 5. REUSE SCHOOL UNIFORM

Reuse school uniform with a regular second-hand uniform shop. A great website company where PTA, Parents can buy, sell, give away & recycle outgrown school uniform is ***Uniformerly***.

# 6. COLLECT INK CARTRIDGES

Collect printing cartridges and toners from parents, local businesses and the wider community. These can then be sent off, refilled and then sold or recycled. Place collection boxes in shops and supermarkets to make it easier for people to drop off their cartridges.

Schools can even collect points for outdoor nature equipment too at ***Empties Please*** and ***The Ink Bin***.

# 7. WASTE-FREE LUNCHES

Adopt a policy for a waste free lunch with refillable bottles for all children and staff. Include guidance on how to pack a waste-free lunch in the form of a short film clip or tips in the school newsletter. Use a QR code.





# 8. RECYCLE WITH TERRACYCLE

Recycle soft plastics with **Terracycle** like writing equipment, crisp packets, chocolate and biscuit wrappers, and toothpaste tubes.

Building a compost heap for fruit and veg peelings, teabags and grass cuttings. A wormery can be made too.



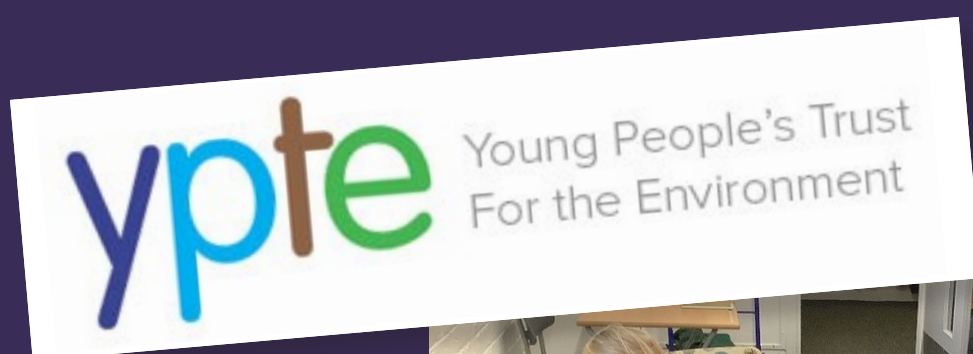

## ***Asthma & Lung – Clean Air Champions resources for Primary Schools***

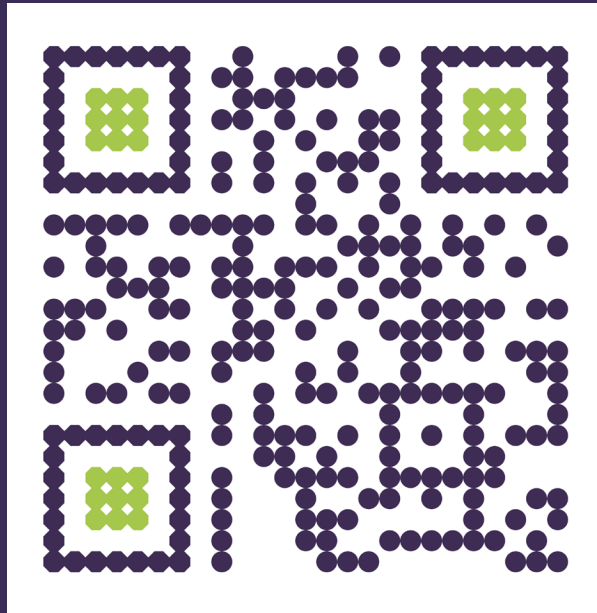
Air pollution is the largest threat to public health in the UK. One in every 11 children in the UK have asthma and breathing in polluted air can be dangerous for them. The Clean Air Champions scheme is a programme that helps primary school pupils become ambassadors for clean air. The scheme helps in raising awareness of the issue with pupils using free resources, teaching campaigning skills such as writing to local MPs, and fundraising via sponsored walks.
